What makes an effective title?

- Attention Seeking Headline grabbing
- Clear impact Announcing the contribution
- Purpose Addressing a need & answering a question
- Use of key-words, but no jargon
- Length Appropriate for the Journal
- Appropriate On target with the article content

Remember these when writing a Title for your manuscript

- For 10 people that see your article, 2 will read it!
 (You lose 80% of the readership)
- What does the readership gain?
 (Editor will see that you've considered the journal)
- Make the target audience as wide as possible (Draw attention to the Abstract)
- Must reflect the content of the Article
 (Essence of the manuscript with key-words)
- Use a temporary "Working Title"
 (This is useful when writing a manuscript)

When reading other articles and draft text

- Try rewriting, creating your version of the Title (Helps you remember the paper - your context)
- Can you create a Title de-novo?
 (Excellent skill, helps colleagues when proofreading)
