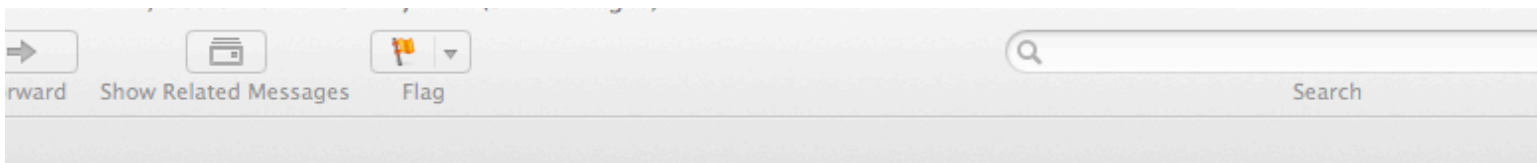

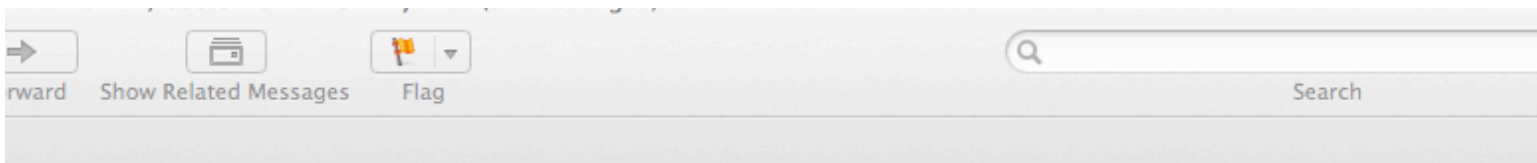

1. b) PubMed and EndNoteWeb

Tue 6 March

This course aims to familiarise students with searching in PubMed effectively and efficiently using a variety of techniques (freetext, MeSH etc). Participants will learn how to manage their references and set up regular alerts on a topic, to import their references into EndNoteWeb, and to create and manipulate a bibliography. The session also includes a brief introduction to [open access issues](#) and [DSpace@Cambridge](#), the institutional repository.
